Review and Selection Process

Every year the Louisville Institute Board appoints a selection committee to review proposals and award Postdoctoral Fellowships. Committee membership and deliberations remain confidential.

Applicants whose projects are not funded will be notified by mail as soon as possible following the adjudication process. Due to the large number of applications the Institute receives, LI Board and staff members do not provide additional feedback on declined proposals.

Fellowship application status will be announced on or before March 1, 2021. Interviews will follow for those selected to move forward in the process.

Duration of Award and Stipend

Postdoctoral Fellowships will provide a stipend of \$25,000 per year for two years. Awardees will also receive housing, medical insurance, and moving expenses.

Postdoctoral Fellows are expected to participate in all six cohort meetings (October, February, June) over the two years of the fellowship. Travel and lodging expenses for these meetings will be covered by the Louisville Institute.

Please note that Louisville Institute grantees may not simultaneously hold two grants or fellowships from Lilly Endowment-funded organizations that total more than \$45,000.

Placement Procedures

Ordinarily, the Louisville Institute will place Postdoctoral Fellows in an appropriate, ATS-accredited theological school. The Institute will arrange two-year placements depending on the teaching needs of the theological school, the disciplinary expertise of the Fellows, and theological fit.

In the event a Postdoctoral Fellow accepts a full-time teaching position in a theological school, and agrees to participate fully in cohort activities, the Institute may support cohort participation, but will not provide the \$25,000 stipend, housing, medical insurance, or moving expenses. The Louisville Institute will negotiate fellowship status and cohort participation on a case-by-case basis.

Cohort Meetings

Postdoctoral Fellows will meet as a cohort three times per year (for a total of six meetings). Each cohort will be facilitated by one pastor and one professor. These co-leaders will structure cohort meetings to help participants achieve the goals of the Postdoctoral Fellowship: (1) to provide an excellent first-time teaching experience in a theological school that the Institute trusts can provide a good introduction to theological education; and (2) to help Fellows more clearly understand and articulate their vocation as theological educators.

Louisville Fellows

Louisville Fellows are dedicated to the vocation of theological education, either by engaging in the lifelong development of their own imagination as theological educators or by supporting others doing the same. Postdoctoral Fellows become Louisville Fellows and are invited to attend the annual Spring Gathering on the campus of Louisville Presbyterian Seminary.

Tips for Saving Money on Textbooks

Every semester, millions of students around the country spend way more money than necessary on textbooks. Many textbook publishers make minor updates to their books every year so they can release them as new editions. This keeps the cost of new books high while driving demand for the old editions down. These older editions of textbooks often work fine for your class since they are mostly the same book as the newer version. Before buying a new edition of a textbook, look for deals on older versions and ask your professor if those previous editions will work in their class. This won't always work because some classes are more textbook oriented than others and will require the latest edition, but it never hurts to ask!

Another way to save money on textbooks and other required reading is to see if you can find a digital copy online. Usually, these digital copies are significantly less expensive than the printed book, and in some cases, are even free! Many of these books come in PDF format so you can view them on your laptop, tablet, or even your phone! Most professors these days try to help save their students save as much money as possible on books, so if you find a great deal on a digital textbook, let your professor know. They might give you some extra credit!

If you are taking classes with friends, you probably will not all need your own copy of the textbook or required reading. Whether or not you can get away with this will depend on how your class is structured, so contact your professor before divvying up who buys which book. If it is allowed, this can save you and your friends a lot of money (some textbooks are over \$300!). This strategy works best when you and your friends set aside time during the week to study together. If you have a lot of required reading to do in a week or if you won't be able to meet up with your friends for a study session, keep in mind that most universities give students between \$10 and \$20 for printing at the university library. You can scan the pages your group needs to read and print or save them digitally. This also helps if you are reading passages from the book in class.

What you need to know:

Types of Award

- Scholars enter the program as either Recruitment or Retention.
- Recruitment Scholars:
- Recruitment scholars are those who are not employed in a permanent civilian position by a SMART Sponsoring Facility (SF) at the time of award. Scholars who are employed by the Sponsoring Facility in temporary or internship positions at the time of award are considered recruitment scholars.
- Recruitment scholars are required to perform summer internships and complete a
 period of post-graduation employment at their assigned <u>DoD Sponsoring Facility</u>.

Retention Scholars:

- Retention scholars are those who are employed in a permanent or renewable term
 civilian position by the Sponsoring Facility (SF) at the time of award. Retention
 employment can be either full-time permanent or full-time term. This should be
 indicated on the SMART application under <u>Professional Experiences</u>.
- Retention scholars work with their DoD Sponsoring Facilities to establish a return to
 work schedule during the summer months. Upon graduation, they are required to
 return to their DoD Sponsoring Facility to complete their service commitment period.
- The DoD assists current government employees further their education and continue their careers as part of the DoD Science and Technology (S&T) workforce. For the most part, current DoD employees, if selected by their current organization, will remain employed by their current organization as retention scholars. Such applicants will be

required to submit contact information for their current employer and a letter from their supervisor acknowledging that he/she is aware that the applicant is seeking funding under the SMART Program.

- Upon acceptance into the SMART Program, scholars will receive a copy of the SMART Scholar Handbook. These terms and conditions apply to scholars that have been offered and have accepted their award.

Citizenship and Security Clearances

Proof of citizenship will be required upon award. EXAMPLE TEACHER ESSAY

So I've decided I want to be an English teacher.

One day in my Freshman English class, I looked at my fellow students and decided that I wanted to be a teacher. We were reciting monologues from Romeo and Juliet, and hardly anyone around me had theirs memorized. The classroom was full of an oppressive and awkward silence before my teacher told us to sit back down with a heavy sigh. I couldn't understand how someone could be so flippant when it came to their grade. I thought that maybe if I became a teacher, I could help inspire them to put in the effort.

I've enrolled in honors and AP English courses throughout high school, and I've joined the creative writing club to continue my hobby of storytelling. As a Senior I finally set this direction of my life in stone by applying to colleges as an English major. It feels like the small, innocuous dream of my Freshman self is finally coming true. Despite all this, part of me knows being a teacher may not be the smartest career choice. Teachers don't get paid a whole lot— I've known many who live in shabby apartments and stay up late grading papers well into the morning, coffee in hand. Many claim that kids are hard to work with, especially high school students, who are full of hormones and rebellion and distrust of authority. The rewards hardly outweigh the costs, some say, with the long hours, too-full classrooms, the low pay and the troublemaker kids. They can't understand why anyone would want to subject themselves to that

But what they don't understand is that I've long since accepted the lackluster aspects of teaching. I've had since Freshman year to mull it over, to discuss with many teachers I look up to about what they think. Every last teacher I talked with told me the same thing: that the reason they became a teacher wasn't for the pay, or for any physical rewards. In reality, teaching is just as much of a learning experience for the teacher as it is for the students. With every essay read teachers learn a little more, and add a new perspective to their ever-growing view of the world. Freshman year I couldn't understand why my friends didn't memorize their monologues, but now I see that there are a million reasons why someone might not. And with that, another mystery of the world is solved. The universe is a little closer to fitting into my jacket pocket.

Being a teacher is like being a thousand people all at once. It is about understanding, and compassion, and knowing all voices should equally be heard. The voice of the youth is the voice of the future, and I want to hear what they have to say. That is the real reason I want to be a teacher: because I know I still have so much more to learn, from people who often aren't considered worth listening to.
