

Women's Independence Scholarship, Inc.

An eligible applicant must:

- Be a female survivor of intimate partner abuse
- Be separated from her abuser a minimum of one year but not more than seven years.
- Have sought services from a non-profit agency that provides services to survivors of intimate partner abuse for a minimum of 6 consecutive months. This agency is willing to act as sponsor by mentoring and providing support to the student throughout her educational experience and can accept funds on behalf of the applicant, should a scholarship for living expenses be awarded.
- Be a citizen or permanent legal resident of the United States, or have an immigration status that makes her eligible for FAFSA,
- Be a current physical resident of the United States or its territories;
- Have applied to or been officially accepted into an accredited course of study at a United States institution.
- Demonstrate a critical need for financial assistance.
- Exhibit a strong desire and the ability to complete a training and/or academic program;
- Have a definite plan to use the desired training to upgrade skills for career advancement, to train for a

new career field, or to enter or reenter the job market.

Do I have to go to a college?

We consider programs at accredited institutions. Some examples of programs that have received funding include:

Nursing, Teaching, Computer Technology, Computer Training, Law Enforcement, Theology, Equipment Handling, Physical Therapist, Social Work, Counseling, Hairdressing, Landscape Design, Journalism, Medical Billing, Massage Therapist.

Support is available for full or part-time students interested in attending accredited programs at educational institutions listed below.

- State supported community colleges
- State supported colleges or universities
- Technical/vocational schools
- Private colleges or universities
- For Profit colleges

A note about For Profit colleges. WISP considers higher education institutions that are owned and operated by profit-seeking businesses the lowest priority for funding, and discourages applicants from seeking an education at a for profit college if there are any other options. For profit colleges have been criticized for using high pressure sales tactics to enroll students,

often have a high cost of tuition which dramatically increases student loan debt, and academics that do not always transfer to other educational programs. We strongly encourage all students to research for profit colleges and be aware of the drawbacks before enrolling.

How is the scholarship paid? What are funds awarded for?

- Demonstrate a critical need for financial assistance.
- Exhibit a strong desire and the ability to complete a training and/or academic program;

Have a definite plan to use the desired training to upgrade skills for career advancement, to train for a new career field, or to enter or reenter the job market. Scholarship Awards for tuition, books and fees are paid directly to the educational institution. This is our first priority for funding.

Charitable Adjunct Assistance Awards, for education-related living expenses that would otherwise be financial barriers to education, are paid to the sponsoring agency on behalf of the recipient.

Categories for spending are rent, utilities, transportation, childcare, basic household expenses, medical expenses (copays, therapy), school. We cannot assist with old credit card debt, legal fees, relocation expenses, large or past due medical bills, entertainment or gifts.

We are prohibited from making any awards payable to individuals. Scholarships are

paid on a by semester/term/quarter/session basis.

What Is A Sponsor?

A sponsor is a non-profit charitable organization with a 501(c) 3 designation from the IRS that provides services to survivors of intimate partner abuse that has worked with the applicant for at least 6 consecutive months. This person agrees to partner with the scholarship applicant and WISP during the application process and throughout the applicant's time in school.

Eligibility

Eligible applicants include graduating undergraduates, recent college graduates, career changers, and current teachers (without a master's in education) who have majored in, or have earned significant college-level credits in, biology, chemistry, or mathematics. Other STEM majors may be considered.

In addition, applicants must meet the following criteria:

- demonstrate a commitment to teaching and learning and the WW Graduate School and its goals;
- have U.S. citizenship or permanent residency;
- have attained, or expect to attain by June 30, 2020, a bachelor's degree from an accredited U.S. college or university or its international equivalent (Note: Undergraduate degrees earned outside the U.S. are accepted if an approved credential evaluator declares the degree equivalent to an earned U.S. bachelor's degree); and
- Have preferably attained a cumulative undergraduate grade point average (GPA) of 3.0 or better on a 4.0 scale (Note: Candidates who can demonstrate excellence through other avenues will also be considered. All applications are considered in their entirety and admission is based on merit).

All applicants submit application materials, including the recommendation form, by the closing date as specified on the web site. All project submissions must contain the following:

- 1. A completed application form, which is found online
- 2. A picture, video or website of their project
- 3. If under 18, the applicant (or all underage team members) must

- obtain and submit a parental/guardian consent form.
- Affirmation that the submission does not infringe upon copyright law or the intellectual property of an uncredited party.
- 5. A completed recommendation form, found on the website, is optional.

PLEASE NOTE: A video, photo or website of the functioning project is required.

Applicants must submit at least a working prototype (or complete business plan if the product is experiential), but more developed products will be more carefully considered.

What is the value of the Young Innovators to Watch Scholarship Program?

Winners will receive a \$1,000 cash scholarship. In addition, they will receive an invitation to attend an all-expense-paid trip for them and one family member to CES 2020 in Las Vegas for an awards ceremony. Winners also receive some pretty cool technology gifts, such as phones and notebook computers!

When is the deadline to apply for the Young Innovators to Watch Scholarship Program?

All submissions are due by November 22, 2019.
