
NATIVE AMERICAN INITIATIVE UTAH VALLEY UNIVERSITY

Utah Valley University is located in Orem, Utah. The university's unique Open Admission policy allows the institution to accept anyone with a high school diploma or its equivalent.


Utah State Board of Regents allows the following tribes to qualify for resident status, as long as students are able to provide Certificates of Indian Blood:
