TRIBE SPONSORS & PARTICIPATES IN DRAGON BOAT FESTIVAL

The sounds of beating drums and cheering onlookers filled Riverfront Park during the Montgomery Dragon Boat Race and Festival on Saturday, August 25, 2012, as 70 teams took to the Alabama River to show who could row, row, row their way to the finish line first. An eclectic mix of teams representing local businesses and organizations, including five tribal affiliated teams, paddled the waters as residents from around the river region gathered to cheer on their coworkers, friends and families.

Maxwell's Air Command and Staff College's Earth, Wind and Water team fought its way to victory during the races. The Montgomery Fire Department's team, The Bravest, came in second. In addition to the overall championship, this year teams representing Auburn University and the University of Alabama took their rivalry to the river in the Battle for the Iron Paddle. In a photo finish, the University of Alabama's Row Tide team took the top spot with a time of 1:27:38. Auburn University's Oar Eagle team came in at 1:27:83.

There was also a battle of the Creeks, with five tribal affiliated teams competing in this challenge. Teams from Wind Creek Casino, Creek Casino Wetumpka, Creek Casino Montgomery, Poarch Police & Fire, and Governmental Affairs battled for victory. The Governmental Affairs team, the Front Poarch Paddlers, was victorious in this challenge!

Wind Creek Casino and the Poarch Band of Creek Indians, were the title sponsors for this year's Dragon Boat Festival. "We are excited to partner with Wind Creek Casino and the Poarch Band of Creek Indians to be one of the largest, family-oriented events in our area. With their generous support, we're able to give even more back to our nonprofits and make the River Region a great place to live and play," race and festival director Andrew Szymanski stated. The Montgomery Dragon Boat Race and Festival raises funds for Bridge Builders Alabama and Rebuilding Together Central Alabama.

DECEMBER 2012 NEWSLETTER DEADLINES

The deadline to submit information to be published in the newsletter is the 10th of the month prior to the month of publication. If the 10th falls on a weekend or holiday, the deadline is extended to the next business day.

The deadline to submit information for the December newsletter is November 10, 2012. This year the 10th falls on a weekend so the deadline is extended to the next business day, which is Tuesday, November 13, 2012 since Tribal Offices will be closed on Monday, November 12, 2012 in observance of Veterans Day. This extended deadline will severely impact the time required to finalize the development, formatting and proofing of the newsletter.

To meet the established deadlines, we are asking that information for the December newsletter be submitted by Tuesday, November 6, 2012. The official deadline will remain at 5:00 p.m. on Tuesday, November 13, 2012, but we are asking everyone to submit information by November 6th if possible.

We understand that some information will not be available until the last minute, but if you have birthdays, anniversaries, birth announcements, etc. for publication in the December newsletter, please submit this information by <u>Tuesday, November 6</u>, 2012.

NEW TRIBAL MEMBER HEALTH BENEFIT ANNOUNCED

A new health benefit has been approved for all PCI Tribal Members. The benefit is a mailorder maintenance prescription drug program. This mail order program allows members to have maintenance medications delivered to their home. Maintenance medications are drugs taken for ongoing medical conditions like diabetes, high blood pressure and asthma. All members using maintenance medications are eligible for this program at no cost to the member.

The program will be administered by Rx Benefits/ Caremark. In August, enrollment forms were mailed to all members, along with details of the program.

This program allows ongoing enrollment; therefore, members may enroll at any time. Once enrollment forms are received, "Welcome Packets" will be mailed directly to the member from Caremark. The packet will contain an explanation of the benefit plan, a card and mail order forms. Members will need to confirm their maintenance drug prescriptions have been written to dispense 90 day supply in order to receive a 90 day supply via this plan.

SCHOOL SUPPLIES & UNIFORM REIMBURSEMENT

The Education Department will be accepting applications for reimbursement of uniforms and school supplies for Tribal Member and first generation Indian Descent students grade 4K through 12. *This program began August 1st and will end October 31st.*

The reimbursement rate is \$200.00 per child, up to a maximum of 4 children. Applications can be picked up at the Education Department or found on the Tribal website, www.poarchcreekindians-nsn.gov.

You must complete the application and attach receipts in order to be reimbursed. Gift cards are issued for reimbursement and are in \$200.00 increments. Your receipts must total at least \$200.00 per child. If your child is first generation descent, you must attach a copy of their "Indian descent letter" from Tribal Member Benefits to the application, unless you participated in this program last year and there is one already on file in our offices. Additionally, we also require proof that your child is enrolled in school. We will accept a current bill, letter from the school, or a copy of your child's report card from school year 2011-2012.

This program is open to Tribal Member and first generation descent children everywhere. Please call the Education Dept. at 251-368-9136 ext. 2021 if you have any questions.

Please Note

This program is for children enrolled in school, not daycare. The child must be enrolled in a school-based program with a certified teacher as their primary instructor.

Ernestine Daughtry's Desire For Education

Ernestine Daughtry was born during the Great Depression; she was raised, and still lives, in the Poarch community. She has four children, 15 grandchildren, 30 great grandchildren, and 1 great-great grandchild. She is a former Tribal Council member and served in that capacity for 15 years. She also served on the Housing Authority for 10 years.

During the time Ernestine was going to school, an education for Poarch Creek students was only offered through the eighth grade. Students were not allowed to continue their education in the city schools and the schools you could go to were limited. This era is forever scarred by the segregation and discrimination that transpired in this area.

In addition to the limited educational opportunities in the community, the jobs available to the Poarch community were also incredibly limited. Most Poarch Creeks were sharecroppers or worked in the pulpwood industry. Limited education, coupled with the lack of job opportunities, left the Poarch Creek community impoverished and nearly destitute.

However, from these dire circumstances, the community banded together and forged a brighter future for itself and its descendants. Today, we all reap the benefits; however, the journey to these benefits was never an easy one.

Through this article, Ernestine will be sharing some of her experiences in her journey and struggle to gain an education. She hopes that her story will prompt each of us to reach out to our relatives and elders to learn about their educational and life experiences so that we may never forget the sacrifices that were made on our behalf.

Ernestine's school years from the first through the eighth grade were spent at "the school on the hill" and at St. Anna's school at the Episcopal Once she finished the Church. eighth grade, that was it...she, nor any of the other Poarch Creek children, was allowed to go on to the ninth grade in town. Ernestine loved school so much and wanted to continue going to school; she began to look for ways to continue her education. Before the next school year began, she spent some time with her Uncle Beady McGhee in

Mobile, hoping to attend school there. Before she could start, her daddy made her come back home. Shortly after that her Aunt Florence Tullis, along with the help of others, persuaded Ernestine's daddy to let her stay with her in Nokomis. She was able to attend school there for a few weeks before her daddy made her come home again.

Ernestine was so determined to get an education that she began to repeat the eighth grade at the Poarch school, just so she could go to school.

Reverend George C. Merkel of St. Anna's Episcopal Church noticed how much Ernestine loved school. He asked her if she would be interested in continuing her education at St. Mary's, an all-girls boarding school in Suwanee, TN. Ernestine was very excited about the opportunity but told Reverend Merkel that he would have to convince her daddy to let her go. Reverend Merkel and Ernestine convinced her daddy to let her leave home and go away to school.

Ernestine arrived at St. Mary's late at night. She was tired from the long journey so she went straight to her dorm, unpacked her bags, and went to sleep. She learned later that all the girls at St. Mary's knew that an Indian girl was coming to their school. They lined up and down the stairs and hallway, just to get a sneak peek at her, but all they could see was the back of her head and her black hair. Ernestine remembers that the next day they all seemed surprised to see that she didn't have a feather in her hair!

Ernestine did not get to stay at St. Mary's very long. Shortly after she arrived her brother Howard was in a pulpwood accident that nearly cost him his life. Her daddy once again sent for her to come home. This was the end of Ernestine's quest for an education.

Ernestine does not consider her adventures at St. Mary's a loss, she met a lot of girls and made some life-long friends; one of them surprised her with a visit on her 80th birthday.

Ernestine was recently the guest speaker at the 2012 Academic Achievement Banquet. She shared her education adventures, hopes, and dreams with those in attendance. She closed her presentation by saying "Even though I did not receive a diploma, I know how important an education is. I have always encouraged my family and friends to go to school and get an education. My desire for all of you is that you will continue to go to school so that you may be successful in whatever you choose to do. Take advantage of all the opportunities that this Tribe has given you, because receiving an education hasn't always been this easy in the past due to discrimination and lack of money."

Ernestine is not the only Tribal Elder to feel this way about education and the opportunities that are available to Tribal Members today. Many of our Elders will tell you the same thing. They made the sacrifices, they faced segregation and discrimination and stood strong so that their children and grandchildren could be exposed to the promise of a better future.

- Every 9 seconds in the US a woman is assaulted or beaten..
- Domestic violence is the leading cause of injury to women-more than car accidents, muggings, and rapes combined.
- Studies suggest that up to 10 million children witness some form of domestic violence annually.
- Everyday in the US, more than three women are murdered by their husbands or boyfriends.
- The costs of intimate partner violence in the US alone exceed \$5.8 billion per year: \$4.1 billion are for direct medical and health care services, while productivity losses account for nearly \$1.8 billion. Men who as children witnessed their parents' domestic violence were twice as likely to abuse their own wives than sons of nonviolent parents.
