To encourage diversity in the live event design community, LDI, in partnership with TSDCA and USITT, announces three \$5,000 Pat MacKay Scholarships for undergraduate students. This scholarship is to support the underrepresented and unique voices in the field of entertainment. These scholarships are funded by LDI/Live Design International.

The "Diversity In Design" scholarships are named for Pat MacKay, formerly publisher of *Theatre Crafts* and *Lighting Dimensions* magazines and founder of the LDI Trade Show and Conference.

She is a USITT Fellow and has served as a mentor for multiple generations of industry professionals.
