Sudden cardiac arrest (SCA) occurring [out of hospital](#) claims over 350,000 lives each year, but still, many people are unaware of the dangers of this condition. Here are six other facts about SCA and automated external defibrillators (AEDs) you might not be aware of:

1. SCA can happen to anyone, at any time, regardless of age, race, or gender.
2. SCA affects roughly 16 people under the age of 18 every day.
3. Only 1 out of 10 people who have SCA outside of a hospital survive.
4. The survival rate for SCA victims decays by 10% for every minute without proper defibrillation; after 10 minutes, survival is negligible.
5. AEDs have voice prompts and will talk the rescuer through every step.
6. Under Good Samaritan Laws, voluntary rescuers are legally protected when aiding those in sudden cardiac arrest distress.

EMPLOYMENT BOOST \$1,000 COLLEGE SCHOLARSHIPS

High school students who have been accepted to college and students who are currently enrolled in a college or university are eligible to apply for the Employment BOOST college scholarship program. Additionally, the following criteria must be met for a student to be eligible to apply:

- Students must be currently enrolled in a U.S.-based high school or college. Students graduating from high school must plan to attend college during the fall semester in the same year as the application.
- Eligible colleges include two-year and four-year universities in the United States.
- Students who apply must have a minimum GPA of 3.6. Current (unofficial) transcripts must be sent with the application.
- High school students who are applying must have a letter of acceptance from the college they intend to attend. A copy of this letter must be included in the application.
- One letter of reference must be included in the application. This letter must come from one of the following sources: a current or former teacher of the student, or a current or former employer of the student.

In addition to these requirements, students applying for each scholarship must submit a 500- to 1,000-word essay. The essay requirements depend on the major the student plans on studying or is currently studying in college.

- Students who are applying for the \$1,000 college scholarship that is open to any major must write an essay based on the poem “Howl,” Part 1, by Allen Ginsberg. You can find the poem [here](#). Carefully read the poem, and use your interpretation of the poem to write an essay that explains what message you believe the writer was trying to convey in the poem. Include what the poem means to you, and why the poem is relevant for today’s society.
- Students majoring in business or a STEM subject (science, technology, engineering, or math) must write an essay based on this prompt: “How is technology going to change your way of life in 15 years?” Your response can include thoughts on subjects ranging from work to home and personal life.

Contact information of the student who is applying, including full name, address, phone number, email address, and intended or current major should be included on each page of the

essay. The same contact information must be included on the letter of reference from the person who is writing the letter.

- Current school transcripts which display a GPA of 3.6 or above.
- Letter of acceptance from a college educational program the applicant plans on attending in the fall semester, or proof of current enrollment in a United States-based two- or four-year college or university.
- Letter of reference from a current or former teacher or employer. The letter must include the writer's full name, address, phone number, and email address, and be typed.
- 500- to 1,000-word essay meeting the criteria based on the scholarship the student is applying for. The essay must be typed and have the applicant's full contact information displayed on each page, including full name, address, phone number, email address, and intended or current major.

Applications are accepted year-round, with quarterly deadlines of April 1st, July 1st, October 1st, and January 1st and must be received within the time frame to be considered eligible to be awarded that quarter. A Grant committee comprised of the Intertech Foundation Board of Directors will judge and select one recipient from the applicants. Factors playing into the selection include:

- Participation in school related organizations

- ACT/SAT score
- Grade point average
- References
- Essay, etc.
- Participation in the National First Robotic Challenge (not required, but favorable)

The scholarship award will be made in two equal payments directly to the student's college or university at the beginning of each semester. The scholarship recipient must maintain a minimum of 3.3 GPA during the first semester to receive the second payment. The scholarship recipient's school must provide:

- Proof of the student's GPA after the first semester
- Proof that the student is in good standing and is enrolled for the upcoming semester
- Receipts for each check received from the Intertech Foundation on the student's behalf.
