

Reid State Technical College

Healthcare needs are expanding within Workforce Development Region 9; the Bureau of Labor and Statistics and the Alabama Industrial Relation Agency projects massive job growth for nursing, health information, and other related fields until the year 2018. Reid State Technical College is preparing the workforce by generating new programs to meet the needs of industry and providing quality healthcare instruction while producing skilled workers.

Medical Assisting Technology (MAT)

The MAT program provides theory and clinical courses aimed at preparing prospective graduates to perform patient care duties in a wide range of medical clinics. Prospective students enrolled in the Associate in Applied Technology Degree will take a minimum of 76 credit hours and will be eligible to take the Certified Medical Assistant Assessment. Students enrolled in the Short-Term Certificate program will complete 26 credit hours.

Emergency Medical Services (EMT Basic and Advanced)

An EMT (Advanced and Basic) short certificate will prepare prospective students

for a career in emergency medical services. EMTs are trained and prepared to work in hospitals, ambulance services and for governmental agencies. EMT courses are completed within 1 semester and will be offered on our Atmore campus.

Physical Therapy Assistant (PTA)

A Physical Therapy Assistant (PTA) provides support in patient treatment programs. In this course of study, PTAs will be trained in providing the rehabilitation of programs related to orthopedics, neurology, pediatrics and sports. The Physical Therapist Assistant Program is a two-year course of study beginning in the fall of each academic year.

Health Information Technology (HIT)

HIT students are trained in utilizing, collecting and maintaining sensitive health records. Additionally, students become proficient in analyzing medical data and gathering health statistics. The Health Information Technology Program is a two-year program which consists of 76 credit hours.

ADDITIONAL NEW PROGRAMS



Barbering (BAR)

The Barbering program is designed to produce and prepare graduates for an entry-level position as a certified barber. The short certificate program can be completed within 2 semesters (28 credit hours) of full-time attendance.

Hospitality and Services Management (HSM)

The HSM program will prepare prospective students for careers in lodging, food and beverage, and recreational services. Prospective students will be trained in customer service and obtain management skills needed to work in the hospitality industry. HSM is a 2 semester program.
