We would love for you to come celebrate with us, and would like to invite you to apply for a booth space to display and sell your arts and crafts.

Applications must be submitted for review by Friday, September 30, 2022 to allow sufficient time for fair consideration. All applications will be reviewed the following week when schedules allow. Applications received after this deadline will be placed on a waiting list and considered only if there is availability. Each application will require approval before being selected to participate in our event. You must provide 4 photos of your merchandise in order for your application to be considered. After approval, someone from the Cultural Department staff will contact you to inform you of approval or denial. During these uncertain times, the Cultural Department will not require payment until check in. The Cultural Department **will not** allow vendors to check-in without sending in an application for approval. In the event the event is cancelled, you will be notified and refunded if payment has been accepted.

**Note: Due to construction, electricity will not be available for any vendors.**
